Approval of Minutes. A motion made by Councilman Sowell, seconded by Councilwomen Kelly to approve the minutes of June 11, 2012 The motion was approved unanimously

City Attorney Fincher presented an Ordinance to conform with recently passed Senate Bill 352 and thereby establishing the office of Prosecutor. Councilwoman Kelly moved for the adoption of the ordinance and Councilman Sowell seconded it. The measure passed unanimously

City Attorney Fincher presented a Resolution appointing City Prosecutor for the Municipal Court to be in compliance with recently passed Senate Bill 352. A motion was made by Councilman Ginn and seconded by Councilman Sowell approving the resolution. The measure passed unanimously.

City Attorney Fincher presented an engagement letter which authorized his firm FWD to represent the City in its negotiations and subsequent legal action regarding LOST and SDS applicable to current activities with the Clayton County Government. Councilman Williams made the motion to approve the arrangement with Councilwomen Kelly providing the second. The measure passed unanimously.

City Manager Lanken indicated that the shopping center across from City Hall is under a new contract with the buyers now clearing contingencies. He stated that the trailer park realtor will be sending the City an offer letter or advising that there is buyer under contract for the property. In the meantime the FDIC and its representatives are fully aware of the City's desire to clear the abandoned trailers from the property.

Eddie Robinson brought the Council up to date on the rewriting of the Comprehensive Plan and Chief Colwell presented police statistics for the month of June 2012.

Under other business Antoni Nix and Phillip Byrdsong from TowMax Towing Service asked about the prospect of bidding on the City's work. They will be placed on the bidders list the next time the matter is offered for public bid.

There being no further business Councilman Sowell moved for adjournment with Councilman Williams seconding the motion. The motion passed unanimously
