An Application for leasing the Community Center was approved for Christine Coleman of DressSwapatl to rent the facility whereby one glass of wine will be served to her guests on December 15, 2012. The City Council voted unanimously to change the rules whereby wine and Champaign would be permitted to be served at the Community Center. In addition, it was agreed unanimously to change the applicable city ordinance thereby allowing the serving of wine and Champaign only on city property. That ordinance is scheduled for reading and passage at the December 10, 2012 Council Meeting.

During the workshop City Attorney Fincher explained the possible loss of revenue flowing from LOST which could amount to approximately \$437,000.

There were five theft cases and two entering auto cases. There were three hit and runs and one shoplifting case during the month which were investigated and processed.
