Approval of Minutes – A motion was made by Councilman Sowell, seconded by Councilman Ginn and the motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance regulating tattoo parlors was discussed by the City Attorney wherein he has scheduled the matter for the March 2013 Council Meeting for consideration and adoption.

Updates

The City Manager advised that the prospective purchaser on the Green Shopping Center is still attempting to negotiate with the bank, but is not having too much success in that regard.

A meeting was being arranged by the City Manager to entertain the representative for a Bottling Plant looking to relocate to the south side. The meeting took place at Grant Wainscott's office together with the City Manager of Forest Park, a representative from Morrow and a representative from Clayton State University.

The Trailer Park was under contract with an unknown purchaser to be closed on February 22, 2013.

The City Manager mentioned that he had an Objective Setting meeting with his staff members for 2013 and included the following subjects

Police Report – The Police Chief stated that last month there were 18 cases requiring CID investigation. There was one missing person report whereby the subject was located in New York. There was a traffic stop which resulted in drug charges and the seizure of approximately \$9,700 in cash.

Public Works Report – The Public Works Director reported that 30 events have been booked at the Community Center through February 7th with anticipated revenue in the amount of \$10,500. In addition \$89, 000 was recovered for back payments from IAA on abandoned automobiles in their possession.

There being no further business, a motion was offered by Councilman Williams, seconded by Councilman Ginn to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously.
