MINUTES

March 9th, 2020

6:30 PM Work Session:

The Mayor called the work session to order at 6:30 PM.

1. The City Manager gave an update for the Lake City Car Show. All of the vendors are scheduled and personnel to work the event have been identified.
2. The City Manager gave an update pertaining to the Lake City Clean up day scheduled for May 2nd, 2020. The time will be 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM.
3. The City Manager gave an update for CENSUS 2020. The City purchased twenty signs to be placed throughout our residential neighborhoods encouraging residents to be counted. In addition, the city will provide computers for residents to fill out the CENSUS at the car show.

Old Business:

The City Manager briefed the Mayor and Council on actions taken by city staff in preparation for the CENSUS 2020.

New Business:

1. The City Manager briefed the Mayor and Council on Amending the 2021 SPLOST IGA by adding that any monies left over from the SPLOST could be used by the City to pay any other approved SPLOST project that may have cost more than was initially allocated. A motion to amend was made by Councilmember Hoover and seconded by Councilmember Kyles and passed unanimously.
2. Police Lieutenant Triplett was recognized for his thirty years of service to the city by a proclamation from the Mayor and Council. In addition, the City Manager Recognized Eric Beckman for his dedication and efforts in the install of new computer servers at City Hall.

Police Report:

Chief Whitmire gave an update on crime as well as the Red Speed camera update. The city is currently waiting for Forest Park to approve the agreement because of a state requirement.

Public Comment:

During public comment a resident who walks the Kroger shopping center complained about the trash in the rear of the Kroger's building as well as the dumpster behind the Asian restaurant.
